Response and turnout time

Turnout time, from dispatch until responding, was under 90 seconds 80% of the time.

October average turnout time is **1.52** minutes.

Average response time for the month of **October** was **13.94 minutes**. This is from the time of 911 call received to arrival at patient. Response times are obtained through Vilas Dispatch Center.

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Transport and Billing

23 of the 31 responses were transported. “*Not Billed*” responses included those that refused transport following medical evaluation or no patient identified. Of the 23 responses that were transported, **17 responses benefitted from Paramedic Level care** with **nine** requiring significant intervention. Paramedic level care is defined as intervention beyond IV placement. Since the start of the district, **75%** of patient transports receive paramedic level intervention. **473.1** loaded miles were recorded.

Crew Activity

October was Fire Prevention Month and NEMSD crews were able to assist with prevention activities at North Lakeland School District. Additionally, NEMSD crew assisted Deputy Chief Mabie providing a Stop-The-Bleed course, supported by the North-Central Regional Trauma Advisory Council, for North Lakeland Staff. Two training sessions were offered for NEMSD staff and volunteers focusing on airway management and sepsis recognition and management. NEMSD crews also completed a combined **58** hours of continuing education.

Planning is also underway to provide an Emergency Medical Responder course (formerly known as “First Responder”) starting in January of 2026. This will allow for additional volunteers available for response within the district.

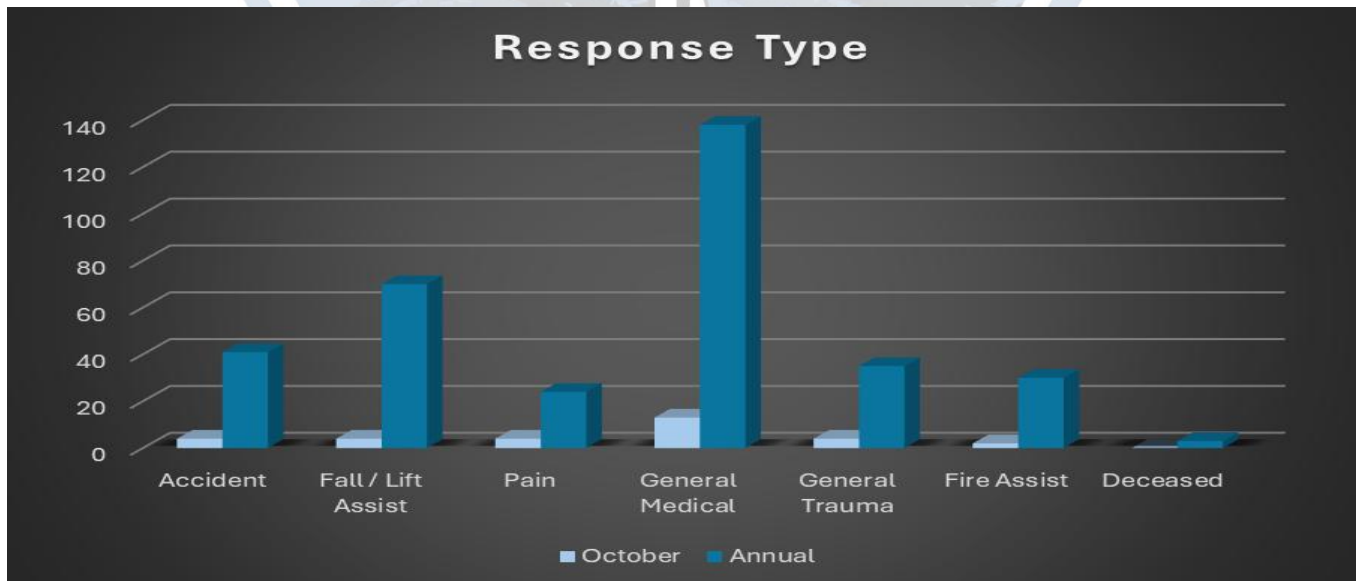
