Response and turnout time

Turnout time, from dispatch until responding, was under 90 seconds 80% of the time.

January average turnout time is **1.52** minutes.

Average response time for the month of **January** was **13.39 minutes**. This is from the time of 911 call received to arrival at patient. Response times are obtained through Vilas Dispatch Center.

Transport and Billing

16 of the 23 responses were transported. “*Not Billed*” responses included those that refused transport following medical evaluation or no patient identified. Of the 16 responses that were transported, ***7 responses benefitted from Paramedic Level care*** with **one** requiring significant intervention. Paramedic level care is defined as intervention beyond IV placement. **381.3** loaded miles were recorded.

Crew / Organization Activities

January 7th was the start of the full EMR course being conducted at the Winchester Town Hall through the NEMSD Training Center. This is a 108-hour course, that upon completion, will allow students to become licensed as Emergency Medical Responders (formerly known as First Responders). To date, there are 18 students enrolled in the course. Many of the NEMSD staff are licensed instructors allowing them to assist with instruction. The course is taught by the chief with materials purchased through the Funding Assistance Program grant resulting in no cost to the students or townships.

NEMSD crews also completed a combined **60** hours of continuing education.

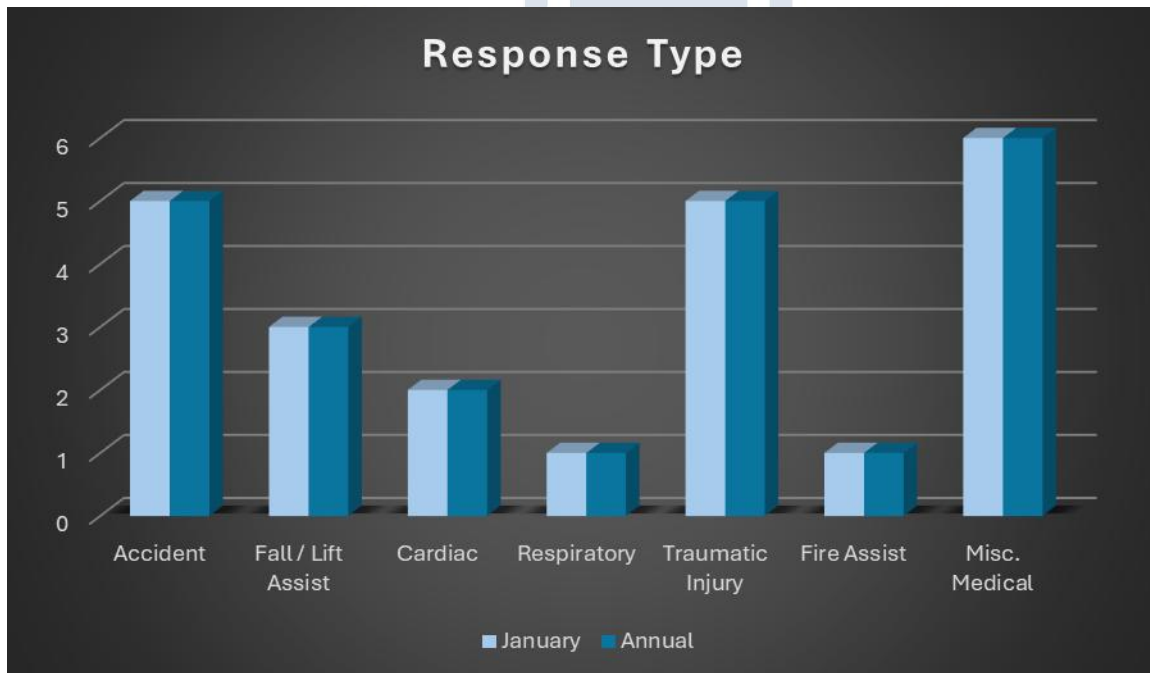
