## Response and turnout time

Turnout time, from dispatch until responding, was under 90 seconds 80% of the time.

**February** average turnout time is **1.7** minutes.

Average response time for the month of **February** was **10.35 minutes**. This is from the time of 911 call received to arrival at patient. Response times are obtained through Vilas Dispatch Center.

## Transport and Billing

10 of the 17 responses were transported. “Not Billed” responses included those that refused transport following medical evaluation or no patient identified. Of the 16 responses that were transported, **6 responses benefited from Paramedic Level care** with **two** requiring significant intervention. Paramedic level care is defined as intervention beyond IV placement. **185.3** loaded miles were recorded.

### Crew / Organization Activities

February resulted in a low call volume month. NEMSD crews took advantage of this and completed a significant amount of training. June of 2026 is when all EMS licenses in the State of Wisconsin must be renewed and each license level carries significant continuing education requirements. February allowed for a significant amount of training to be completed.

Chief and Deputy Chief attended a regional training with law enforcement and emergency service partners to begin planning for active threat responses. These incidents require intense coordination to effectively mitigate, and this training resulted in large steps in advancing regional readiness.

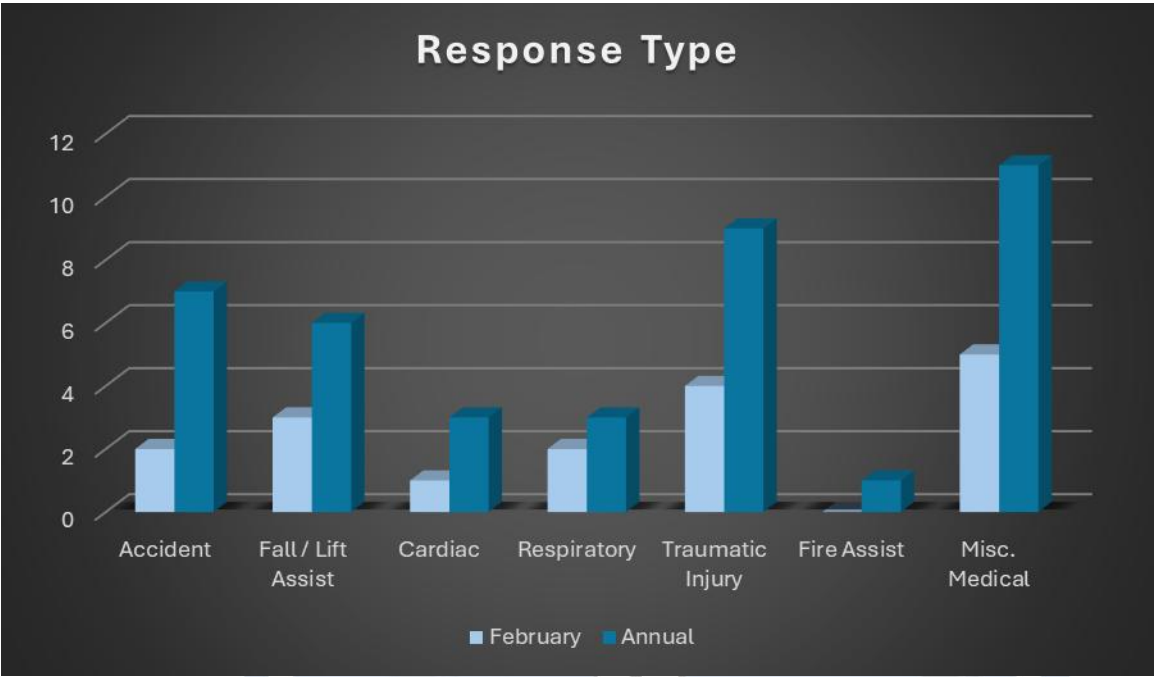
NEMSD crews also completed a combined **143** hours of continuing education.
