## Response and turnout time

Turnout time, from dispatch until responding, was under 90 seconds 80% of the time. **April** average turnout time is **1.68** minutes.

Average response time for the month of **April** was **13 minutes**. This is from the time of 911 call received to arrival at patient. Response times are obtained through Vilas Dispatch Center.

## Transport and Billing

14 of the 22 responses were transported. “*Not Billed*” responses included those that refused transport following medical evaluation or no patient identified. Of the 14 responses that were transported, **9 responses benefited from Paramedic Level care** with **one** requiring significant intervention. Paramedic level care is defined as intervention beyond IV placement. **349.4** loaded miles were recorded.

## Crew / Organization Activities

April presented the district with a lower call volume; however, NEMSD staff were busy with preparations and familiarization with new clinical protocols. After the initial year of operations, clinical guidelines were scrutinized, adjusted, and implemented to better serve the needs of residents and visitors. Additionally, all licenses are due for renewal in June of 2026 and there is significant hour requirements of education needed. All NEMSD staff and volunteers are taking advantage of every education opportunity to prepare for this process in early June.

NEMSD crews completed a combined **126** hours of continuing education in April.

On April 25<sup>th</sup>, the initial EMR course was completed with **ALL** students successfully completing the requirements for licensure. The community is lucky to have these dedicated individuals to serve.

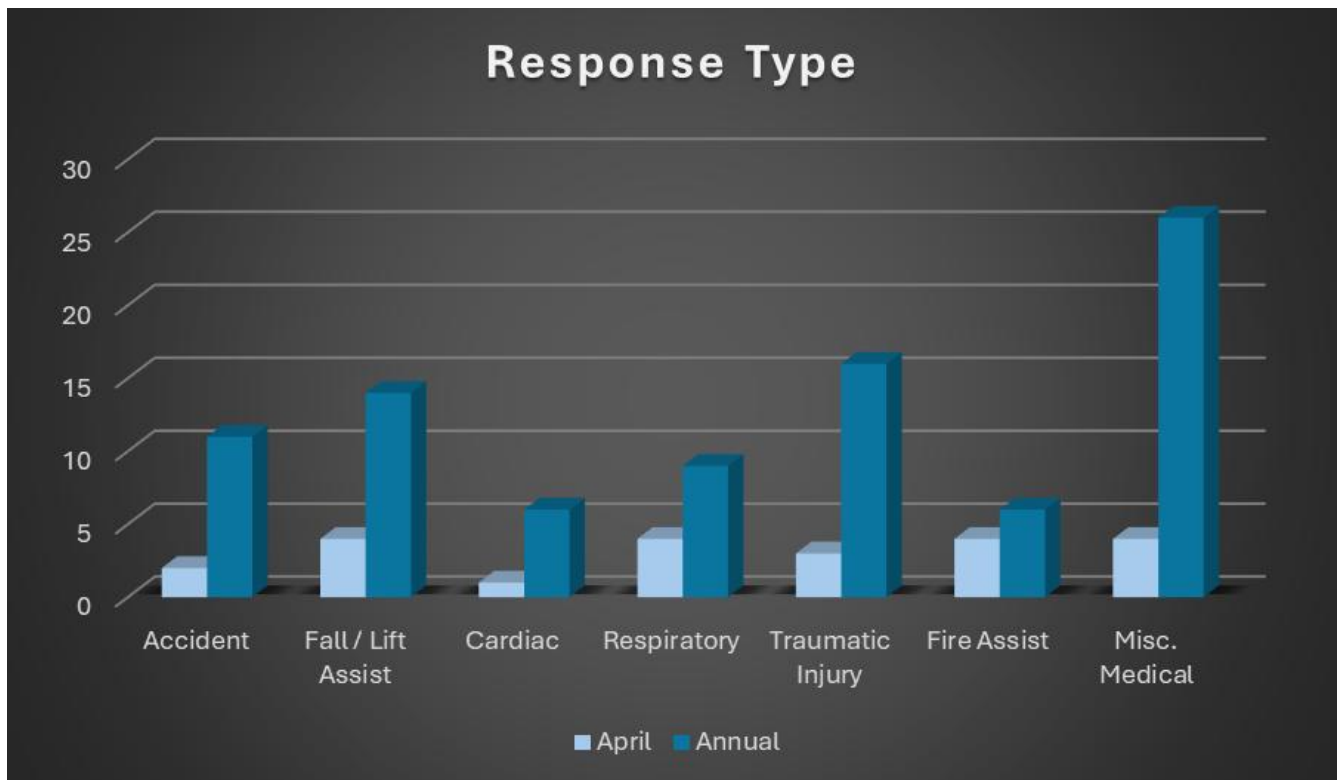
